

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



The Visitor Hon'ble His Excellency President of India Sri Ram Nath Kovind

A lawyer, veteran political representative and long-time advocate of egalitarianism and integrity in Indian public life and society, Shri Ram Nath Kovind was born on October 1, 1945, in Paraunkh, near Kanpur, Uttar Pradesh. His parents were Shri Maiku Lal and Smt Kalawati.

Before assuming charge of the office of the 14th President of India on July 25, 2017, Shri Kovind served as the 36th Governor of the state of Bihar from August 16, 2015, to June 20, 2017.

Educational and Professional Background

Shri Kovind completed his school education in Kanpur and obtained the degrees of B.Com and L.L.B. from Kanpur University. In 1971, he enrolled as an Advocate with the Bar Council of Delhi.

Shri Kovind was Union Government Advocate in the Delhi High Court from 1977 to 1979 and Union Government Standing Counsel in the Supreme Court from 1980 to 1993. He became Advocate-on-Record of the Supreme Court of India in 1978. He practised at the Delhi High Court and Supreme Court for 16 years till 1993.

Parliamentary and Public Life

Shri Kovind was elected as a member of the Rajya Sabha from Uttar Pradesh in April 1994. He served for two consecutive terms of six years each till March 2006. Shri Kovind served on various Parliamentary Committees like Parliamentary Committee on Welfare of Scheduled Castes/Tribes; Parliamentary Committee on Home Affairs; Parliamentary Committee on Petroleum and Natural Gas; Parliamentary Committee on Social Justice and Empowerment; and Parliamentary Committee on Law and Justice. He was Chairman of the Rajya Sabha House Committee.

Shri Kovind also served as Member of the Board of Management of the Dr B.R Ambedkar University, Lucknow, and Member of the Board of Governors of the Indian Institute of Management, Kolkata. He was part of the Indian delegation at the United Nations and addressed the United Nations General Assembly in October 2002.



From the Vice-Chancellor's Desk



Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor Prof. Rattan Lal Hangloo

It is my privilege to present this year's Annual Report of the University. The University has made great strides with significant contributions in its academic and administrative fields despite various infrastructural constraints. The University is also conscious of its responsibility towards sustainable environment. I feel happy to share that the University is working on generation of the 1.434 Mega Watts solar energy, which would be supplied to the main grid. The University of Allahabad is one of the premier institutions in North India to initiate the process of fully solar enabled campus, which would contribute clean energy to the main grid. Other than the University, it will also supply electricity to the city during holidays, thus, making it more innovative. The University also initiated long-pending recruitment process (there were no regular recruitments for more than three decades in the University) and recruited new faculty members in different departments / centres so as to make the teacher-taught ratio balanced in some of the departments. More than half a dozen of our Distinguished Teachers had brought laurels for the University when they were shortlisted, for the first time in the history of the University, in the top 10 Universities of the country out of 70 Universities for the Festival of Innovation and Entrepreneurship held at the Rashtrapati Bhawan, New Delhi. It is a matter of great satisfaction that faculty members were awarded prestigious fellowships like the Fulbright Fellowship and associateship of International Centre for Theoretical Physics (ICTP), Italy etc. The University had also sent four students under MoU to Heidelberg University where they had completed one semester. A couple of MoUs had been initiated with different Universities, particularly with the Tennessee University, USA, and Comenius University in Bratislava, Slovakia. Library facilities had been improved, Remotex had been made operational. The University had the unique distinction of getting the largest-ever grant from DST – FIST and DBT. The University has bagged a grant of Rupees Six Crore from UGC for renovation of some of the Departments in the Science Faculty including the Museum of Zoology Department, the Laboratory of Bio-Chemistry Department and Institute for Inter-disciplinary Studies (I.I.D.S.). We also got fund for the Genome Research Foundation, which will facilitate Networking of Research Institutions to the tune of Rs. 10 Crores. Several projects of approximately Rs. 35 Crores have been undertaken by Faculty members. The best ever water facility had been provided in the University Hostels for which the University had to make a special provision with the UGC whereby thousands of liters of water were being provided daily to each of the University Hostels. The University also has got funds for the three new hostels including one international hostel. The University has finalized long-standing demands of the date of eligibility of faculty members after a gap of almost thirty years. The University has also resolved the long pending MACPS matters to the satisfaction of the employees and they are contributing their 100% to the cause of the University.

I am sure that all sections of the University family: the teachers, the students, the employees, the officers and other stakeholders would continue to contribute, as ever, their best to bring laurels to this great Institution of Higher Learning.

- To create conducive environment for focused learning.
- To provide world class infra-structure and facilities.
- To promote innovation and entrepreneurship.
- To engage with the society through out-reach activities and applied research.

MILESTONE OF THE UNIVERSITY

University of Allahabad has always occupied an esteemed place among the universities of India for over a century now. Established on 23^{rd} September 1887, it is the fourth oldest university of India after Calcutta, Bombay and Madras University. The credit for conceiving a large Central College at Allahabad, eventually to develop into a University, is due to Sir William Muir, the then Lt. Governor of United Provinces. As a result of his initiative the foundation stone of the Muir Central College (named after him) was laid on December 9, 1873 by His Excellency Lord Northbrook. On September 23, 1887 Act XVIII was passed which established the Allahabad University. Allahabad University was a centrally-funded Affiliating University exercising jurisdiction over higher and secondary education in a wide area in northern and central India, comprising the present-day States of Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Rajasthan and the Vidarbha region of Maharashtra. In 1905 it initiated teaching and research under its own aegis, by establishing the Departments of *Law* (1905), *Economics* (1908) *History* (1912), research fellowships, libraries and laboratories. The eminence of the faculty of its teaching Departments, the Muir Central College (the premier affiliate, founded in 1873 at Allahabad) and several other reputed Affiliated Colleges, earned high regard for the University within and outside India. Some of the Colleges themselves matured into Universities (1920 and 1923).

The University was later reorganized as a provincially-funded unitary teaching University, comprising its own teaching Departments and the Departments of the Muir Central College (which was merged with the University). The other Affiliated Colleges were initially grouped under the External Wing of the University and then handed over (in 1927) to the newly-incorporated, University of Agra in 1927, and the responsibility for secondary education was transferred (in 1922) to the U. P Board of High School and Intermediate Education. In the ensuing three decades, under the stewardship of celebrated Vice-Chancellors (Sir Ganganatha Jha, Pt. Iqbal Narain Gurtu, Prof. Amaranatha Jha and Prof. Tara Chand) and the academic leadership of illustrious faculty, the University took determined steps to enlarge its intellectual and educational ambit and gave a lead in national emancipation. Several teachers and students played a prominent role in the national struggle, particularly from 1930, and the University solemnly recalls with pride the martyrdom of its student Lal Padmadhar Singh during the Quit India Movement.

The scholars who gave a distinctive flavour to the academic ambience of the University, from its first venture into teaching in 1905, are too numerous to be named individually, and included such legendary figures as Amaranatha Jha, Raghupati Sahai "Firaq", S. C. Deb and P. E. Dastoor (English), H. N. Randle, R. D. Ranade and A. C. Mukerji (Philosophy), L. F. Rushbrook Williams, Sir Shafaat Ahmad Khan, R. P. Tripathi (History), Syed Muhammad Ali Nami and M. G. Zubaid Ahmad (Arabic and Persian), P. K. Acharya, Babu Ram Saxena and Kshetresh Chandra Chattopadhyaya (Sanskrit), Dhirendra Verma, Devi Prasad Shukla and Ram Kumar Verma (Hindi), Syed M. Zamin Ali and Muhammad Hafiz Syed (Urdu), Beni Prasad, Tara Chand, Ishwari Prasad (all three being historians of repute) and A. B. Lal (Political Science), R. N. Dubey (Geography), P. S. Naidu (Education), Meghnad Saha, K. S Krishnan, D. S.

Kothari, Salig Ram Bhargava, R. N. Ghosh G. B. Deodhar and K Banerjee (Physics), N. R Dhar, Satyeshwar Ghosh and Satya Prakash (Chemistry), A C. Banerji, Gorakh Prasad, P. L. Srivastava and B. N. Prasad (Mathematics), J. H. Mitter, Shri Ranjan, R. K. Saxena and R. N. Tandon (Botany), D. R. Bhattacharya and H. R. Mehra (Zoology), H. Stanley Jevons, S. K. Rudra, C. D. Thompson, B. P. Adarka and J. K. Mehta (Economics), M. K. Ghosh and R. C. Choudhury (Commerce) and J C. Weir, M. U. S. Jung, K. K. Bhattacharya, K. R. R. Sastry and T. N. Sapru (Law) During this "Golden Age", the University was often referred to as "The Oxford of the East".

With the advent of Independence, the University gave priority to the rising expectations of the people for wider access to higher education and keeping pace with the world in higher education, took up concerns crucial to national and social reconstruction. The Seventieth Anniversary Celebrations (1957) were marked by the affirmation to concert intellectual resources for exploring new academic, educational and social horizons while conserving its classical heritage. The Centenary Celebrations (1987) provided the opportunity to reaffirm the goal of academic modernization predicated on social responsibility

The University did, however, face difficulties in mobilising resources for the pursuit and fulfilment of its intents and objectives. This paved the way for a concerted campaign, which began with the Seventieth Anniversary and was reinvigorated from the Centenary Celebrations, for the re-incorporation of the University as a Central University. These efforts, which were immeasurably, strengthened by the support of the Alumni in different fields of national life, bore fruit in 2005, with the adoption by Parliament of "The University of Allahabad Act, 2005", and its enforcement on July 14, 2005.

This restoration of the original 'Central Status' has inaugurated a new Chapter in the evolution of the University, and occasioned a fresh resolve to realize its earlier stature as an internationally acclaimed institution of higher learning. The University is now poised for exploring new dimensions of institutional accomplishment, by renovating its academic system, reinforcing and augmenting its teaching, research and residential facilities and pursuing social purposes in a coordinated manner, to keep pace with international standards in these areas and endow human resource with the capabilities to serve the nation in the special context of the challenges and imperatives of globalization.

HIGHLIGHTS OF UNIVERSITY INITIATIVES

ACADEMICS

- Major steps have been taken to execute the academic vision plan in terms of reorganization of the departments and centres into schools to promote teaching and research in cross-disciplinary and interdisciplinary thrust areas of national importance. This has paved the way towards introduction of new courses in the areas of Humanities, Social Sciences, and Sciences.
- Steady reforms have been brought about in examination and evaluation system. The University has started secured digitization of University degrees using NAD.
- The University follows Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in all the PG courses.
- University constituent colleges have started PG programmes from the session 2016-17.
- Initiative to start research programmes in the constituent colleges of the University is in the process of approval by the competent authority.
- To inculcate high learning in the campus, prominent academicians and scientists have been invited under the Distinguished Lecture Series.
- Unprecedented and continuous academic activities have been witnessed on the campus with the organization of National and International Seminars.
- The University got connected with other Centres of advanced learning in the country as well as abroad through national and international collaborative arrangements and MoUs.
- Four students from the Centre of Boinformatics, Centre of Biotechnology and Department of Botany were sent to Heidelberg University, Germany to attend Winter School Programme on 'Big Data Research in Biosciences' organized from 25th January to 29th March 2018.
- Continuous improvement in the student's performance has been reflected through increase number in various examinations viz: NET, GATE, IIT-JAM and various other State and Central Government jobs.
- Several students of various departments like Department of Political Science, Defence were selected as Assistant Professors through U.P. Higher Education.
- Awards/recognitions have been given to outstanding students, teachers (including retired teachers) and non-teaching staff. The eminent scholars, artists, social activists etc. have also been felicitated for their contribution on the occasion of 15th August and 26th January.
- Procurement of new equipments in various departments was done through equipment grants.
- Timely and continuous monitoring of the progress of the research students has drastically improved the research standards and quality of D.Phil. programme of the University.
- The condition of the Central Library of the University has significantly improved in terms of collections of books and journals. The process of modernization of the library including creation of the e-library is underway. The plagiarism detection tool URKUND has been made available to faculty and research students.
- University of Allahabad is connected to Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) and e-PG *Pathshala* on SWAYAM platform. The audio-video lectures are being prepared/ recorded.
- A quantum jump in research publications by the faculty members of University of Allahabad is a welcome sign of healthy and competitive environment of research. The infrastructure for research facility, uninterrupted power supply and other necessary facilities through constant encouragement and motivation by the academic leadership has resulted in sudden spurt in publications.
- Foundation stone of Neuro-imaging facility at Centre of Behavioural and Cognitive Sciences, Centre of Excellence has been laid.

FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

- Purchase Procedure-2017 has been prepared and approved by the competent body of the University by incorporating General Finance Rules (GFR)-2017.
- The disbursement/payments from the University accounts have been made by implementing VISAKA (Vittiya Saksharta Abhiyan) guidelines.
- Proper utilization of funds is being ensured as per GFR-2017.
- Financial Ledger is being compiled on a daily basis to ensure maximum transparency.

- E-procurement (e-tendering) system and e-GEM is now fully functional in the University.
- Several faculty members of the University and Colleges were promoted under CAS.
- Regular appointments were initiated for the posts of Registrar, Finance Officer, Controller of Examination, and Librarian.
- The CCASH has been made functional. The Committee is working towards prompt relief to the complainants.
- Zero tolerance has been shown towards the anarchy and indiscipline of students and staff.
- The University of Allahabad Alumni Associations has been setup to extend the current alumni database of the University. The active involvement of the Alumni, their suggestions regarding improvement in the quality of teaching and research and their generous support towards creation of corpus fund for the general development of the University shall be very useful in coming years.
- Appointments in the constituent colleges of the University have been facilitated by filling the long pending vacancies as per UGC norms.

EFFECTIVE USE OF THE ICT FOR TEACHING, ADMISSIONS AND E- GOVERNANCE

- The University conducted Online Entrance Tests for UG, PG and DPhil courses at all India level. Admission to various courses of study for the academic session 2016-17. With the help of this exercise, the University started attracting young, talented, and potentially bright students from all over the country.
- ICT enabled Smart Class Rooms have enhanced in several departments for effective teaching-learning using modern aids.
- The University has extended the Wi-Fi facility in the University campus as well as in hostels.
- Campus wide LAN installation and management is being ensured. Through the utilization of its (limited) resources, the University is also making its best efforts to exploit most of the benefits offered through the National Knowledge Network (NKN) connectivity.
- The campus wide CCTV surveillance system at strategic locations has been completed and commissioned to the University.
- The Automation processs to the Finance and Registry sections has been initiated.
- Several courses have been designed by various University departments as per MHRD digital initiatives of SWAYAM and MOOCS.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND STUDENT AMENITIES

- North Hall, Senate Hall campus of the University was renovated to hold meetings and seminars.
- In view of the order of Hon'ble High Court the entire hostel of the University was evicted after a period of more than 30 years and as per the order the hostels were internaly repaired and painted within record time of one month.
- Swami Vivekanand laboratory of the Department of Biochemistry was inaugurated on 23rd June, 2017.
- Students' help line especially for the girl students has been initiated. This facility has the feature of maintaining confidentiality and remedial of grievances.
- Anti-ragging cell has been reconstituted as per UGC guidelines and implemented effectively.
- The Construction of several new buildings will start from next academic session- new building in the Nehru Science Centre complex for the Sophisticated Analytical Instrumentation Facility and M N Saha Centre for Space Studies, Students Activity Centre.
- Upgradation of students' facilities including construction of new hostels and laboratories are being taken up at the priority level.
- Strict instructions have been issued regarding maintenance/restoration of civil/electrical works in the Hostel buildings mostly decayed and in knockdown condition on a war footing.
- The Squace Court has been renovated and is now fully functional for the students and faculty members.
- Freeships and scholarships are being distributed to economically vulnerable students for hostel accommodation as well as University fees.
- Jawahar Lal Nehru Centre for differently abled students of the University has been equipped with modern computational/technological gadgets.
- The renovational work on conservation of Vijayanagaram Hall of the University, an English architectural beauty and one of the Allahabad's famous landmarks is almost completed.







Gender wise distribution of total students in various UG, PG & Ph.D. Programmes (2017-18)


Category-wise distribution of UG students enrolled in 2017-18





FACULTY OF ARTS

DEPARTMENT OF ANCIENT HISTORY, CULTURE & ARCHAEOLOGY

Introduction:

The Department was founded in 1955 with the objective of promoting research and teaching in ancient history (including pre-history and proto-history) and ancient world civilizations. The Department excavated the world famous archaeological site of Kaushambi from 1948 to 1964 with outstanding results. The Department was chosen for Special Assistance Programme (SAP) by the UGC for three consecutive phases from 1981 to 1995. It was also granted the status of Centre of Advance Study (CAS) from 2001 to 2006. The Department carried out International Collaborations with a) University of California, Berkeley (1980-82), b) Soviet Union on the Project, "Comparative Archaeology and Ethno-Linguistic Studies" (beginning in 1980), and 3) Australian Research Council (2005-2008).

Departmental museum (Prof G.R. Sharma Memorial Museum) houses a unique collection of antiquities spanning from Prehistory to early medieval period. Research/scientific analysis is being carried out on different antiquities and artifacts.. The department has archaeological research laboratories, a Photography Unit, a Drawing Section, Libraries (PG, as well as, Research) and a Publication Unit.

Department has following facilities:

- **G.R. Sharma Memorial Museum** developed out of cultural material recovered mainly through excavations and explorations in the Northern Vindhyas and the Middle Ganga plains by the archaeologists of the Department.
- **B.Experimental Archaeology Lab**: Since its inception, January 2010, the lab has had been engaged in understanding **Cognitive Ecosystemof archaeological landscape** combining the results of the various scientific experimental techniques:

DEPARTMENT OF ARABIC AND PERSIAN

Introduction:

The Department of Arabic & Persian is an old as the Muir Central College, Allahabad itself. The renowned scholar Maulavi Zakaullah of Delhi had the honour to grace the chair as the first Head of Arabic and Persian Department. His ancestors were great scholars and had the opportunity to teach the Moghal Princess for many generations.

Maulavi Zakaullah's interest was not confined to the Oriental Languages alone. He was a versatile genius and a great scholar of Mathematics and Science. He has written 143 books on various subjects other than Arabic & Persian.

Maulavi Zakaullah was succeeded by Maulavi Amjad Ali who organized Arabic and Persian courses and examinations during his Headship. The Degrees of Maulavi, Alim, Munshi, Kamil and Fazil were being awarded by the University but later on the job of awarding these degrees was handed over to U.P. Government.

Maulavi Mohiuddin Jafari, MaulaviMohd. Ali Nami and Maulavi Mahdi Hasan Nasiri were also teachers in the department. Besides, teaching Arabic and Persian Mohd Ali Nami could compose poetry in Persian, when a delegation of Iran visited this University in 1944 he welcomed the members of the delegation with his Persian poems.

In 1922 the University organized B.A. and M.A. courses in different subjects and made provision for conducting research. A galaxy of scholars were appointed in Arabic & Persian among whom Dr. A. S. Siddiqui, Dr. Zubaid Ahmad and Naimur Rahman are most important.

After India achieved independence, a high powered Arabic and Persian committee was constituted which was presided over by Hon'ble Maulana Abul Kalam Azad (Education Minister of India) and a few more renowned scholars who were nominated members of that body. Form Allahabad University Prof. Naimur Rahman and Prof. M.G. Zubaid Ahmad were nominated members of that body.

Dr. Zubaid Ahmad found an able successor in Dr. Saeed Hasan who was a man of varied abilities and served the University in a number of capacities.

Another renowned scholar of Persian Dr. Shabih Ahmad was also on the staff who is still remembered by his admirers. Dr. M.A. Siddiqui succeeded Dr. Saeed Hasan. He was a studious man who wrote a number of books and articles. Dr. M. A. Siddiqui was succeeded by Prof. M. Rafiq, a true scholar who laid great emphasis on the acquisition of knowledge and hard work than on merely passing examinations. Other teachers of the department were Prof. H. G. Murtaza, Prof. A. L. Al-Hindi, Mrs. Shabbir Fatimah, Mrs. U.K. Rizvi, Prof. Syed Tufail Ahmad etc.

The Govt. of Indian has been honouring prominent scholars of Arabic, Persian and Sanskrit on the eve of Independence Day each year. Prof. A. S. Siddiqui, Prof. M. A. Siddiqui, Prof. S.M.I. Nadvi, Prof. S. T. Ahmad and the present Head, Prof. Abdul Qadir Jafari are recipients of this prestigious National President Award. Prof. Jafari was felicitated by the Hon'ble Chancellor of on his first visit in 2006 also.

Apart form this the Department has produced a good member of distinguished Arabic and Persian scholars, administrators and diplomats who served and are serving in the country and abroad.

- To achieve excellent in the fields of Translation, Arabic & Persian Languages and literatures classical as well as modern.

DEPARTMENT OF MEDIEVAL AND MODERN HISTORY

Introduction:

The Chair of Professor in Department of History was created in 1912-13. Academic lectures and teaching commenced in December 1916. Gradually eminent historians joined the department on the invitation and appointment made by the first HOD, Prof. L. F. Rushbrook Williams. Those joining in 1917-1919 period include Ishwari Prasad, R. P. Tripathi, Beni Prasad, Sir Shahafat Ahmad Khan and Dr. Tara Chand. Two of the above earned the D.Litt. degree of the London University by working under the legendary Haraold Laski – Beni Prasad and R. P. Tripathi. By 1935, when the first session of the Indian History Congress was held at Pune – it was deemed necessary to unanimously elect Prof Shahaft Ahmad Khan, the then HOD of our Department as its first president because of the immense contributions made by the historians working under his stewardship. Their contributions gave rise to what came to be emerging later as the "Allahabad School of History".

DEPARTMENT OF MUSIC AND PERFORMING ARTS

Introduction:

Established in 1926, the department of Music and performing Arts has a long and illustrious history, when the well known music lover and the renowned academician Dr. D.R. Bhattacharya started a Music Association in 1926 and the first music conference was organized under the auspices of this Association and Dr. D.R. Bhattacharya was the Vice-President. Two years Junior Diploma in vocal and instrumental music was started in 1935 and diploma in painting in 1937 in women's college campus. In 1942 senior diploma in vocal and instrumental Music was introduced and in 1945 the music vocal, instrumental and painting became a formal academic subject at undergraduate level and the regular teachers were appointed. It was only in 1947 that Dr. Amarnath Jha, Vice-Chancellor of Allahabad University laid down the foundation of the building of Music department and in 1950 a small building was constructed for the music department and inaugurated by the then Hon'ble Governor Sri. H.P. Modi. But again this building was handed over to Urdu Department in 1968 and the Music classes were again shifted to women's college campus. Only in 1970 by the courtesy of Prof. A.B. Lal, the Pro-Vice-Chancellor, building of the music department was constructed and inaugurated on the auspicious occasion of Basant Panchami in 1971 and since then the department has flourished on every front from 1973 onwards. P.G. classes were started and research work also began as a follow up. The department till now offered teaching at B.A., M.A. and Diplomas and conducted research, but from July 2003, the department of music has introduced Bachelor of Music, B. Mus three years Degree course in Vocal / Sitar / Tabla and M. Mus (Change in MPA from 2016-17) from 2006-07 for enriching the quality of teaching music and to advance specialized training to the students. From 2005, the department included male candidates in B.Mus (Change in BPA 4 years Degree course from 2016-17) programme as a follow-up in M.Mus also. In B.A. this provision was since 2001. The department also introduced practical screening test for P.G. entrants in Music from July 2003 and included Rabindra Sangeet in B.Mus degree programme. The department also started 2 years diploma course in Indian classical Kathak dance from session 2006-07.

DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHOLOGY

Introduction:

The Department of Psychology at Allahabad University was established in 1961 with Prof. Durganand Sinha as the first chairperson and two other faculty members. In 1977, the UGC approved it as a Department of Special Assistance (DSA) and the faculty strength was increased to 20. In recognition of its outstanding contribution to the field of Psychology in India, the Department was upgraded as the centre for Advanced Studies (CAS) in 1984 by the UGC. The Department was evaluated by the UGC and second, third and fourth terms of CAS were sanctioned between the period 1989 to 2008. In 1989, the Department started an international journal 'Psychology and Developing Societies' in collaboration with the Sage publications which is now in its 29th year. The Department was the first in the University to start D. Phil. with

The Department was the first in the University to start D. Phil. with course work as early as in 1979. Semester system in P.G. 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DEPARTMENT OF SOCIOLOGY

Introduction:

The department of Sociology started in June 2010. The main research thrusts of department are: Agrarian studies, Development studies, social movements, Subaltern studies and Sociology of Health and illness. So far, the Department has organized one symposium, one national seminar, one UGC sponsored Refresher Program, Pre-Dphil Programme, 5 Public Lectures and two consultancy programme.

In the M.A. I semester, the students do conduct field studies individually in their place of residence relating to religious ceremonies and analyse the data in order to write reports. M.A. III semester students conduct library exercise to understand the issues of modernization and development of India in a comparative framework with selected African nations from secondary resources. Field study was conducted by the M.A. II semester students w in the city of Allahabad on the broader theme of 'Youth' as a category. The sub-themes are: Youth and Education; Youth and Gender; Youth and ICT (Information Communication Technology); Youth and Politics; Youth and Religion. Similarly, M.A. IVth semester in-depth case studies among patients admitted to or visiting the hospitals in and around the Allahabad city. The major sub-themes include: The socio-economic profile of the households/patients; Folk wisdom on health and illness; Health programs and evaluation in rural/urban areas; Challenges of effective health care system in rural/urban areas; Maternal and child health – promise and realities; Doctor patient relationship – people's doctor and professional distance; Accessibility, affordability and accountability

All the faculty members are involved in inculcating the skills to the Post-graduate class members in matters of preparing interview schedules, collecting data from the villagers, preparation of coding manuals, entry of coded data, analysis of the data through SPSS and finally writing small reports.

DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS

Introduction:

The Department of Economics became a truly full-fledged department in 1914, with the appointment of Herbert Stanley Jevons (son of the marginalist, W.S. Jevons) as the first Professor of Economics and Head. A post-graduate course was also introduced the same year, so that the fledgling department offered both, under-graduate and post-graduate courses. Prof. Jevons also founded the Indian Journal of Economics, in the year 1916, the first economics journal ever to be published in India. This is the oldest existing journal of Economics and is regularly published. In an article, published in its first volume in 1916 and available even today in the Department, Prof. Jevons wrote that his academic purpose was "*teaching to think and to do, rather than of teaching only to know*".

This legacy of his was faithfully adhered to by stalwarts like Professors C.D.Thompson, A.R.Burnett-Hurst and S.K.Rudra, Mr. B.P.Adarkar, and later by Professors J.K.Mehta, P.C.Jain, S.L.Parmar, Mahesh Chand and many others. Faculty members such as Prof. H.S. Jevons, Prof. C.D. Thompson, Prof. S.K. Rudra and Prof. J.K.Mehta became Presidents of the Indian Economic Association Conferences of 1922, 1934, 1946, and 1968 respectively. Former faculty of the Department who became Presidents were Dr. M.V. Mathur (1967), Prof. Gautam Mathur (1978) and Prof. P.D. Hajela (1980). Allahabad had the proud privilege of hosting I.E.A. conferences in the years 1920, 1929 and 1940.

The Department also has a Planning and Development Unit, created through an endowment by the Planning Commission, Government of India, with the renowned development economist, Jean Dreze as the Honorary Chair Professor. The UGC also selected the Department under Special Assistance Programme (SAP) in 2004-05, DRS- I level. It was further renewed in 2009-10, DRS-II level. The Department looks ahead further to convert it into a Centre for Advanced Study. The Department offers a UGC - approved one year employment-oriented, Post Graduate Diploma in Foreign Trade Practices and Procedures (DFTPP) since 2002-03. The Departmental library has more than fifteen thousand books and it subscribes 35 national and international journals, along with about 40 journals received under exchange basis through the Indian Journal of Economics. It is in the process of modernization through digital cataloguing. The Department also has a Statistical/Computer laboratory for the research scholars. Prof. P.C. Jain an alumni of the Department contributed significantly to the establishment of the Departmental library in the present form.

Introduction

Law as a subject was introduced in the year 1872 in affiliation with the Calcuta University. In 1887 the Department of Law was established and in the year 1890, the Department became a separate single Department /Faculty of the University along with the faculties of Arts, Science and Commerce. Hon'ble Justice D. Straight was appointed as the first president of the Department. The Law Department functioned in Muir College from 1872 onwards till the new building was constructed for the Law Faculty around 1910, adjacent to Senate House. By an Act of the United Province of British India Prof. Weir, a distinguished jurist became the first Head of the Law Department. The Department was sifted to the new building which was constructed by UGC grant in the Chatham Lines Campus of which Hon'ble Mr. A.K. Sen the then Law Minister of India, had laid the foundation stone in 1965

The endeavour at Faculty of Law, University of Allahabad is to provide excellence in legal education. We aim at expanding the horizons of legal knowledge for full growth of human personality and well being of man kind. We also aim at devising, developing and applying new teaching techniques, research methods and also arrange for extension programmes in legal education. We strive to develop better human resources for trade, industry, public administration, departments of law and justice.

In keeping with its best tradition of reform and excellence in legal education, the University launched a Five Year Integrated Course of Law w.e.f. the academic session 2005-16. Its prime purpose and avowed aim is to fashion new techniqs of teaching and design courses to cope with the challenges and issues in contemporary society. A separate building for Law Five Year Integrated course has been build in the same premises.

DEPARTMENT OF BIOCHEMISTRY

Introduction:

The Department of Biochemistry was established in 1968, and was one of the few Departments in the country to start a Master's course in Biochemistry. In view of the growing importance of Biochemistry, both as a basic science as well as a broad based discipline, the Department introduced Biochemistry at the undergraduate level in the year 2000. The Department presently offers a 3-year undergraduate program (B.Sc.) with Biochemistry as one subject, a 2-year Master's program (M.Sc. Biochemistry), and a Doctoral program. Department organizes weekly students' seminars and frequent invited lectures by leading scientists from across the world, with a view to develop quality personnel in the field of Biochemistry. The National Conference on 'Emerging Trends in Biochemistry' organized by the Biochemistry department in 2010 assumes special status because lead papers presented in this Conference were published in the Cellular and Molecular Biology, a peer-reviewed international journal published from France.

The Department has faculty strength of eight members. The research interests of the faculty include: oxidative stress and antioxidants, xenobiotic metabolism, molecular biology of HIV-1, anti-HIV-1 drug design, toxicology, aging research and anti-aging interventions, micronutrients and their role in health, association of polymorphism with cancer and natural product based anti-microbials, hepatoprotectants and anticancer agents. The faculty is engaged in collaborative research with several institutions and universities.

DEPARTMENT OF BOTANY

Introduction:

The Department of Botany which was earlier a part of Biology Department of Muir Central College started as a separate entity in the year 1923, with Dr. J.H Mitter as the founder Head of the Department. Now the department has completed 94 years of its glorious existences under the stewardship of eminent botanists like Prof. S Ranjan, FNI, Prof. R.K. Saxena, FNI, Prof. R.N. Tandon, FNA, Dr. A.K. Mitra and Prof. D.D. Pant, FNA. and others who have adorned the professorial chair of the department. All of them maintained the great tradition of excellence in research and teaching. The department is known for multidisciplinary character and has earned international recognition for its standard of teaching and research producing eminent scholars and administrators, who have occupied or occupying high positions in and outside the country. In recognition of its academic excellence, the department of botany was awarded two prestigious programmes by the UGC 1- The special assistance programme (1976) 2- The COSIST support programme (1990).

- Roxburgh botanical garden and Experimental farm- The department is maintaining perhaps the best botanical garden in the country which is famous for the rich collection of rare Pteridophytes, Gymnosperms and Angiosperms. It is maintaining the best collection of rare Cycads and Conifers. Besides these garden is also maintaining some rare and endangered plants of Pteridophyte and Angiosperm. The avenue of bottle palms and panels of different plant give panoramic view to the garden.
- Agharkar Museum- The department has a Botanical Museum which is located on the first floor of east wing of the botany department. The museum is named after Dr. S.P. Agharkar, whose name figures among the legendry botanist of the country. The museum is well known for its rare collection of living and fossil plant belonging to different plant groups from Algae to Angiosperm.
- Duthie Herbarium- The department is maintaining the best collection of herbarium plants of various groups like Bryophytes, Pteridophytes, Gymnosperms and Angiosperms. It includes the rare prized collection of Duthie, King, Kustler, Dudgeon, Cave, Wallich and Gamble. There are nearly 25000 specimens. It has also the rich flora of different districts of UP.
- Central Instrumentation laboratory- Department has central instrument facility (CIL) which has AAS and UV-Vis spectrophotometer.
- Departmental Library-The Departmental Library contains about 13,000 books on Botany and 250 books on Environmental Science. The Library reading room can accommodate about 100 students at a time and it remains open to the teachers, post graduate students and research students of the Department from 8.00 am to 6.00 p.m.

Thrust Areas:

The department offers teaching in three main courses at the post-graduate level: 1. Botany, 2. Agricultural Botany, and 3. Environmental science. All the post-graduate courses are having semester system. The under-graduate programme is integrated with B.Sc. curriculum of the Faculty of Science. The curricula are continuously updated. The ongoing research programme emphasizes diverse areas of functional, structural, applied and evolutionary botany. The main emphasis is given on the following areas which are identified by UGC as areas of excellence in the department:

- 1- Palaeobotany, Morphology and Anatomy
- 2- Plant Pathology including Microbiology
- 3- Plant Physiology

The laboratories are well equipped with latest instruments.

There are other areas of interest like Taxonomy, Bio-diversity, Palynology, Ecology, Cytogenetics and Molecular Biology which are also attaining excellence.

DEPARTMENT OF ELECTRONICS AND COMMUNICATION J.K. Institute of Applied Physics & Technology, University of Allahabad

Introduction:

Soon after the independence, the first Prime Minister of India, Pt. Jawahar Lal Nehru realized the need of a pioneer institute in the field of Applied Physics and related subjects. On his initiative an agreement was made between University of Allahabad and J.K. trust, Kanpur on November 22, 1947, to establish the J.K. Institute of Applied Physics and Technology in the premise of Faculty of Science, University of Allahabad. J. K. Charitable trust contributed for the construction of the complete building of the institute. The foundation stone was laid by late Pt. Jawahar Lal Nehru, on April 14, 1949. Pt. Nehru also inaugurated the first academic session of the institute on April 4, 1956. Initially a 3 year post-graduate degree course named as M.Sc. (Technology) was started in the department. Later in 1970, on the advice of AICTE, the course was converted to a post B.Sc. – three year degree course (B.Tech. in Electronics and Communication) and a new course in M.Tech. (Electronics Engineering) was introduced. Undergraduate course (B.Sc.) in computer science was started in 1982. The Post graduate course in Computer Science (Software) was started in the year 1986. The Defence Research and Development Organization (DRDO) had selected the institute as a center to generate man power in computer science (Software). In 2008, a three year B.Tech. (Electronics and Communication) course was replaced by four year B.Tech. (Electronics and Communication Engineering) degree course and a new branch, Computer Science and Engineering, was also introduced. The institute has a very good placement record and the Alumni of University are spread throughout the world and are occupying key positions in their field.

The department is going to start a new course Master of Computer Applications (MCA) from the session 2018-19.

DEPARTMENT OF HOME SCIENCE

Introduction:

The Department of Home Science was established in 1945, in pre independent India, with the mission of educating Indian women. At the time a two year course of undergraduate level was initiated in the department. In 1969 the UGC recommended to the University to open post graduate degree for women in Home Science department. At this juncture Prof. Radha Pant was the Head of of Home Science. She took the opportunity to establish a Biochemistry Department in the building of Home Science. Gradually all the teachers of Home Science retired and the two departments came to be named as Department of Biochemistry and Home Science. In 2000 the Hon Governor of U.P. ordered that the Home Science Department to be bifurcated from Biochemistry Department. Dr. S. Srivastava took charge in 2003. The department has since then been working with a single permanent faculty. The department runs a 3 year degree course comprising of 16 papers and 14 related practical. The U.G programme is a skill based programme. It's a multidisciplinary subject having post graduation in four subjects namely:

- Food and Nutrition
- Textile and Apparel Designing
- Human Development
- Family Resource Management
- Currently the department with its limited resources of having only one permanent faculty member runs P.G. in Textile and Apparel Designing. The department has 8 Research Scholars.

Thrust Areas:-

It is a multidisciplinary subject. Subjects like community nutrition, diet therapy, interior decoration, culinary skill development, apparel designing and stitching, flower arrangement. Each theory paper is accompanied with related practical. Student also sent the community to share with their laboratory experience. Folk songs and street plays are scripted and enacted by the students to foster behavioral changes in the masses. Students are ready to work as entrepreneurs, dieticians, boutique owners, flowerists and confectionary, after the finish their undergraduate degree.

The department has a post graduate professional course in Textile and Apparel designing (TAD). The thrust in the course is to turn them into expert in dress designing, CAD & tailoring. After this course the students are industry ready.


Outreach activities:



The Centre of Bioinformatics at University of Allahabad came into existence in 2002. The Centre offers 4semester (2 years) M.Sc. Program in Bioinformatics. Master in Bioinformatics program is credit-based course covering frontier areas of Bioinformatics and Computational Biology. It is aimed at transforming students into trained Bioinformaticians with adequate theoretical and practical knowledge for investigating and addressing a number of key biological issues.

Introduction:

The research in the area of Climate Dynamics Modelling has been started in the University of Allahabad with the establishment of twin centres namely K. Banerjee Centre of Atmospheric and Ocean Studies (KBCAOS) and M. N. Saha Centre of Space Studies (MNSCOSS) in the year 2000 and 2001 respectively with the financial support from National Centre of Atmospheric and Ocean Research (NCAOR), Goa (Ministry of Earth Science (MoES)) and Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO) under the academic leadership of Dr Avinash C Pandey. The faculties associated with these centres have successfully completed projects funding of more than Rs. 5.00 crores. KBCAOS participated in the scientific expedition to Southern Ocean/Antarctica on board R/V Akademik Boris Petrov (ABPetrov) in 2006 and 2009 to obtain surface, atmospheric and oceanic data of southern ocean. KBCAOS and MNSCOSS has multi-disciplinary and multi-institutional character, which made them national centers working in close collaboration with other national/international institutions involved in Ocean and Atmosphere modelling research. Several scholars have already obtained doctoral degree from the centers in a wide variety of topics dealing with Mathematical Modeling of Atmosphere and Ocean and are well placed in the academic and research institutions of its repute. UGC has recognized KBCAOS and MNSCOSS as centers with potential of research excellence and established new permanent Department/Centre of Atmospheric and Ocean Science (AOS) at University of Allahabad, which came in existence on 29th October, 2009. The state-of-the art computing facility is available to perform Atmospheric and Ocean Modeling at AOS/ KBCAOS/ MNSCOSS. The department/centre has High Performance Computing (HPC) having one master node and 17 Compute nodes. In addition to this the department/centre has multiprocessor workstations of SGI, USA and HP.

Faculties of the department/centre are well exposed and trained at leading national and international institutions of its excellence as evidenced from there bio-data. The AOS has active research collaboration with International Centre for Theoretical Physics (Italy), Centre for Ocean-Land-Atmosphere Studies (COLA), USA, Columbia University, New York, USA and John Hopkins University, USA.

High Fluence Ion Beam Facility: Accelerator Center made functional

Introduction:

The *High Fluence Ion Beam facility* at University of Allahabad is complementary to the existing accelerator facilities in our country, as presently there is no facility, which can provide the fluence planned. We have acquired a state of the art supernanogan ion source as described above.

It will be operated as a User facility with time allotment for approved projects by a National Accelerator User Committee (NAUC) or by a User Committee closely associated with NAUC.

Thrust Areas:

- The objective is to run the accelerator based research facility in Allahabad University using ECR ion source to create an environment for pursuing experimental work in interdisciplinary areas.
- Accelerator based laboratory will provide best possible environment for training human resource as it encompasses latest technologies such as data analysis, computer control, analog and digital instrumentation, Ultra high vacuum, etc.
- It will be gradually developed for providing opportunity to younger generation to get involved in projects involving state of the art technologies.
- An in-house facility of this type in the university will most certainly help in attracting students towards experimental sciences.

Centre has again adopted five (05) Villages of Koraon Block, Allahabad as an initiative of Unnat Bharat Abhiyan and MHRD, New Delhi.

In campus selection out of 14 interested candidates, 8 have been selected and well placed. It is also worth to mention that University of Allahabad has been identified as spoke partner of Design and Innovation Centre of IIT-BHU getting funds from MHRD. Further, the university approved the change of nomenclature from M.Sc. Rural Technology and Development to M.Sc. Design and Innovation in Rural Technology.

CENTRE OF FOOD TECHNOLOGY

Introduction:

The creation of Centre of Food Technology under Institute of Professional Studies was done with a vision to encompass food science, food production, food processing, food technology, food safety, food management, entrepreneurship development, food processing and rural development; agriculture and industry linkage through food processing, quality assurance for safe food, research and development on functional foods. M.Sc. Nutritional Sciences was started in year 2000. M.Sc. Food Technology programme was initiated in July 2002 as per the guidelines of UGC and ICAR. This was facilitated by a grant from Ministry of Food processing Industries, Govt. of India under its "Manpower Development Programme". The Centre has been sanctioned nearly Rs. 1 crore by MoFPI for setting up a commercial quality control laboratory to serve the industry in surrounding areas by providing testing services for quality assurance and food safety. The Centre is currently offering M.Sc. and Ph.D. degree programmes. In 2015, UGC has also sanctioned about Rs. 90

lakh for offering B.Voc. Food Processing and Technology in linkage with Sector Skill Council which has been started from the year 2015.

Recently, the Centre has established an NABL accredited Food Analysis and Research Laboratory for commercial testing of food and water sample which is also given status of Nodal Lab by FSSAI (Annexure IV). The Centre has been granted externally funded projects from time to time through various nodal organizations such as UGC, DST, APEDA, UPCAR etc.

Thrust Areas:

- To strengthen R & D in the area of food safety and health foods.
- To establish Industry-Academia interactions for internship and in-plant training for better placements of students.
- Upgrading Food Analysis and Research Laboratory (FARL) for testing of food samples for nearby industries.

NATIONAL CENTRE OF EXPERIMENTAL MINERALOGY AND PETROLOGY

Introduction:

The National Centre of Experimental Mineralogy and Petrology (NCEMP) is a University of Allahabad research Institute/centre. It was established for the advancement of high-pressure-temperature research in India. There are different types of High Pressure Temperature equipments such as Multi-Anvil High Pressure-Temperature apparatus (unique in India), Piston Cylinder High P-T equipment and Hydrothermal apparatus. The centre has sophisticated analytical equipments such as Electron Probe Micro Analyzer and powder XRD equipments for material characterization. It also has a well-equipped workshop and other technical facilities (quenching apparatus, hot press and ball milling techniques). The NCEMP also conducts synthesis of advanced novel materials such as sol-gel.

Fundamental research in the field of high pressure and temperature mineralogy and petrology of the Earth is being conducted in this centre. We are conducting experiments for measurements of conductivity of various materials like polymer, gel or rock samples with frequency and temperature, change in phase at high pressure and temperature, seismic velocity and rate of ascent of magma, etc. under high-pressure and temperatures. Other research work such as synthesis of glasses from silica sand applying magnetic separation technique and nano polymer composite materials are also undertaken. Recently facilities for gemstone synthesis and characterization are being developed to promote gemmology.

The NCEMP provides high quality analytical facilities to students and researchers. Periodically research scholars, students and faculty members from various institutes, constituent colleges and universities are exposed to the research facilities available through Short Courses, Laboratory Visits and lectures etc.





Future Plan of Action: Tasks Ahead in 2018-19

The Rajiv Gandhi Chair proposes to engage in following works, if tenure extended further than 31 March 2019 by the University Grants Committee, New Delhi-

Most importantly, the Chair at present does not have its complete strength; there are five vacant positions out of
seven that includes one position of Chair Professor, two positions of Junior Research Fellow and two positions of
Technical Assistant. These appointments that have been halted due to uncertainties of Chair's continuity and lack
of timely availability of grant can be made possible with immediate effect.

- Work is in progress to bring out an edited volume based on the papers presented in the national seminar titled "State, Marginality and Empowerment" organized by the Chair during April 28-29, 2015 is in its final stage. The editing work for the volume is over and is in the process of finalizing the publisher.
- Two project proposals 1). "Examining the Scope of the Right to Education Act: A Case Study of Allahabad District and 2). Contesting Women's Empowerment: A Case Study of Women Panchayat Leaders of Allahabad District is under consideration to commence work on them in future. On completion of the project, the report shall be published by the Chair.
- The Chair stands committed to continue to engage in significant academic deliberations by continuing to organize lectures, seminars, conferences, workshops, symposium etc. as done in the past. A number of lectures are currently lined up for the current academic session 2018-19.
- The Chair intends to hold short-term certificate courses for students as well as organize capacity building programmes for teachers in higher education on issues of contemporary relevance, here of course the focus would be on a). Nuclear Disarmament; b). Secularism & Nation Building and c). Social Justice. Experts from academia, media as well as NGOs of related area would be invited to deliver lectures on relevant topics. The short-term certificate course would be spread around 10-15 days so that a particular topic is covered thoroughly and at the end of every course the students would be issued certificates.
- As done in the past, Chair intends to continue with the organizing panel discussions on topics that contemporarily assumes national importance and deserves to be explored. For example the Chair is considering at present a proposal of organizing a panel discussion on the 'Disgruntled Youths of Jammu & Kashmir: Myth Vs Reality'.
- Chair proposes to publish its lecture series in future. It has been proposed that the lectures shall be thematically arranged to come out with an edited volume based on the collection.
- The Chair intends to come out with its annual magazine that shall underline all the activities undertaken during a particular academic session. All seminar and lecture reports can appear in detail in this magazine. Apart from this the papers presented during short certificate courses, panel discussions, workshops etc can also appear here.
- The Chair maintains an absorbing collection of books in its library. The Chair proposes to enrich its library by adding to its collection of books. Preparation of book list is under consideration to be purchased under the library grant of the Chair. These books are specifically focused on the thrust areas of the Chair.
- All the above activities have been planned so that the Chair is able to provide a think tank of professionals, intellectuals and community leaders. The think tank would not just provide a shared understanding and numerous perspectives and solutions to varied contemporary challenges but also help universities and academics in public policy making.



STUDENTS' WELFARE ACTIVITIES

OFFICE OF DEAN STUDENTS' WELFARE

The year that has gone by was marked with the DSW set up making tangible gains by way of consolidation and giving thrust to its major initiatives .The year also erased the shadows/pangs of transition in a large measure. Better amenities, larger financial allocation in assistance to students, better healthcare, hygiene, spurting sporting activities and, the last but not least, the hard fought and won peace and tranquility in hostels and the campus have been the cornerstone of the multifaceted activities of the preceding year. Progress and development have been at the core of all DSW and his team endeavors. The progress, though slow but surefooted, has instilled yet greater resolve to pursue the unfinished agenda of growth. Unquestionably the mood at the DSW set up has been upbeat and triumphant.

Here are some of the modest successes achieved through sustained team spirit and camaraderie to which the DSW Board, teachers, officers, staff, and students have contributed immensely.

Welfare Measures (General)

- Disbursal of Rs. 20,00,000/- as scholarship to poor though meritorious students under the Government of India sponsored Merit cum Means Based Scheme .
- Financial assistance towards meeting partial expenses for medical treatment to students suffering from serious diseases, accidental injuries etc.

Health Facilities of Students:

• University Health Centre is running for the medical welfare of students and employees of the University under the supervision of Senior Medical Officer. Homoeopathy wing is also running. Two ambulance is working for the transport/medical facility of the bonafide students of the University & hostels.

Students Union Election:

• Election for the student union was held in the session 2017-18. The students union office -bearers given encouragement, aid, and guidance, to organize various student related activities. As such, a large number of seminars, conferences, and, Departmental cultural program were held under the auspices of student union.

Welfare of Physically challenged students.

Jawaharlal Nehru Centre for Differently Abled Students has been the nodal Centre for facilitating and supporting academic and digital inclusion for the differently abled students of the University of Allahabad. In the session 2017-2018, it continued to provide the necessary academic resources for the students. It is equipped with computers, scanners, several screen reading software's (specially meant for visually challenged) etc. The Centre was established in 2009 and, therefore, it was a high time overhaul these facilities. In pursuance of this 11 computer systems were overhauled for their efficient functioning. Further, the problem of access and the provision of barrier free environment for the differently abled students was addressed. It was declared by the University Administration that barrier free buildings are a necessary pre-condition for facilitating the educational inclusion of differently abled students and, in pursuance of this, designs for railing and ramps etc have been cleared for the old departmental building of the University. At present the work for provision of barrier- free building is at an advance stage. The grievances of the differently abled students was active hostel allocation were addressed and they were allotted room in the University hostels on a priority basis. Also, given the constraint of space in the hostel, the Jawaharlal Nehru Centre for the Differently Abled Students was activity involved in facilitating the admission of students in the hostels for the visually-challenged students run by the State Government. Due to the support and facilitation by the Centre even some visually challenged student could do well

in the competitive examination for professional courses and jobs. The differently abled students who could not be get admission in University hostels were accommodated in State Government hostel through the efforts of the centre.

Hostels (Boys and Girls)

- In Compliance of the Hon'ble High court order, University & Trust hostels were vacated with the help of District and Police administration & for the session 2017-18, students were admitted course wise in different hostels.
- The internet Wi Fi facility of the hostels of the university was upgraded.
- Installation of RO plants & Water purifiers in all the University hostels to ensure supply of pure drinking water for the residents of the hostels.

Measures to enforce discipline, law and order in the Hostels and the Campuses

- Setting up of anti ragging cell to monitor/redress the menace of ragging in hostels and campuses. Teams made massive surprise checks and succeeded in containing incidence of ragging. Thankfully constant vigil resulted in no serious cases of ragging.
- Periodic raids/strict vigilance of combined teams of DSW/Proctorial board and Warden/Superintendent of the hostels carried out to evict anti social elements/ students with criminal records. Tough measures to enforce discipline yielded positive results.
- Organized Meditation/Yoga and health check up camps in the hostels & University Health Centre in collaboration with various prominent NGOs working in this area. Health check up camps for girl students organized on Sundays in collaboration with Women's Advisory Board (WAB) were largely attended.

Scholarship and financial assistance to the students by the DSW office

- Disbursal of Rs. 20,000,00/- as scholarship to poor though meritorious students under the Government of India sponsored Merit cum Means Based Scheme. The scholarship awarded to maximum 400 students of UG/PG/IPS/Professional courses @ Rs. 5000/- per student for a session. For the session 2017-18, 353 eligible students were awarded McM scholarship.
- Financial assistance towards meeting partial expenses for medical treatment to students suffering from serious diseases, accidental injuries etc.
- Financial assistant for the purchase of books to the poor students out of Poor Boys Funds account. For the session 2017-18, 136 eligible students were awarded assistance.
- Financial assistant for the cultural programme in the various departments of the University were granted.
- Financial assistance was also given to students of different units of the University for organizing their annual functions. The Jawaharlal Nehru Centre for Differently abled students organized International Day for persons with disability under the aegis of DSW office.

JAWAHARLAL NEHRU CENTRE FOR DIFFERENTLY ABLED STUDENTS

Jawaharlal Nehru Centre for the Differently Abled Students was set up in the year 2009 during the XIth Five Year Plan (2007-2012). In pursuance of its mandate and objective it achieved the following in FY 2017-2018:

The Jawaharlal Nehru Center for Differently Abled Student started the initiative to upgrade the ICT facilities available with it for the differently-bled students of University of Allahabad. Under this initiative 10 state-of-the-art computer system worth Rs. 3,99,990=00 (Three lakh ninety nine thousand nine hundred and ninety only) and 5 scanners worth rupees twenty six thousand six hundred and twenty six (Rs. 26,626=00) were installed in the center . The supporting accessories and furniture worth rupees fifty eight thousand (Rs. 58,000=00) was also installed. Thus, a total ICT infrastructure and facility of more than Rs. 4.84 lakh was added to the total existing assets of the center.

The Jawaharlal Nehru Centre for Differently-Abled Students (JNCDAS) of University of Allahabad organized an Essay completion and a General Knowledge Competition on the eve of International Day for the Person with Disabilities (IDPD). Several other extra-curricular activities were also organized in the run-up IDPD function. The winners of these competitions were given prizes in IDPD function. JNCDAS celebrated the International Day for person with Disability (IDPD) on December, 03-12-2017 on UN-mandated theme.

To supplement the hostel facilities provided by University of Allahabad for differently abled students, the U.P. state government hostel for differently abled students (Rajkeya Drishtibadhit Chatravas) accommodated more than 25 differently abled students of A.U. in the 2017-2018.

In pursuance of the decision taken by the Academic Council of AU in its meeting held on 14-12-2015 vide resolution on. 22/27 regarding consider the letter dated 02-07-2016 of Coordinator, Jawaharlal Nehru Center for Differently Abled Student to set up a Department of Disability Studies (to be set up as a Independent Unit in the Institute of Inter disciplinary Studies) the Executive Council set up a committee to finalize the proposal for the same. This committee finalized the proposal and the proposal will now be sent to UGC/MHRD for approval.

Apart from above work the center promptly addressed the grievances of students regarding hostel, academics etc.

SPORTS BOARD

Introduction:

The aim and object of the Sports Board are to promote physical well being of the University students in general, by providing facilities for game and sports and by organizing competitions and tournaments. Keeping in mind, the aims and objectnies, the activities of the Board are planned. Inspite of the infrastructural deficiency and resource crunch, the Board has been able to achieve National level achievements. A brief report about the achievements of the Board are as follows:

1. UNIVERSITY LEVEL ACTIVITY.

Selection trials/Coaching Camps were organized in different discipline for the final selection of the University teams. The selected teams participated in U.P. NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS) NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME "Not Me But You"

In India, the idea of involving students in the task of national service dates back to the times of MAHATMA GANDHI. The central theme which he tried to impress upon that the first duty of the students should be, not to treat their period of study as one of the opportunities for indulgence in intellectual luxury, but for preparing themselves for final dedication in the service of those who provided the sinews of the nation with the national goods and services so essential to society The National Service Scheme (NSS) was started on September 24,1969 during the GANDHI CENTENARY YEAR as it was GANDHIJI who inspired the Indian Youth to understand their social responsibility ,establish a meaningful linkage between the campus and the community for social uplift of the down-trodden masses of our nation. Starting with an enrolment of 40,000 students in 37 universities in1969, the coverage of NSS students, in 2015-16 increased to 34,00,000 students 0f 336 Universities, Colleges, Technical and management institutes and +2 councils in 35 states and union territories.

The primary objective of National Service Scheme (NSS) is:

"PERSONALITY DEVELOPMENT OF VOLUNTEERS THROUGH COMMUNITY SERVICES"

Secondary objectives are:

- i. Understand the community in which they work.
- ii. Understand themselves in relation to their community
- iii. Identify the needs and problems of the community and involve them in problem-solving
- iv. Develop among them a sense of social and civic responsibility
- v. Utilize their knowledge in finding practical solutions to individual and community problems
- vi. Develop competence required for group-living and sharing of responsibilities
- vii. Gain skills in mobilizing community participation
- viii. Acquire leadership qualities and democratic attitudes
- ix. Develop capacity to meet emergencies and natural disasters and
- x. Practice national integration and social harmony

<u>Motto</u>: The Motto of NSS "Not Me But You", reflects the essence of democratic living and upholds the need for self-less service. NSS helps the students develop appreciation to other person's point of view and also show consideration to '/other living beings..

<u>Financial Arrangements and Organizational structure:</u> The scheme is entirely funded by the Central Government from the financial year 2016-17 to organize Regular Activities (RA) and special Camping Programmes (SCP). An amount of Rs.250/-per volunteer per annum is released towards Regular Activities (RA) and Rs.450/- per volunteer per Special Camping Programme (SCP) which is of 07-days duration to be organised in the adopted villages/communities. In addition, the Government of India provides 100% financial assistance to run NSS Regional Centres, State Liaison Cells and TOCs/TORCs, The Central Government also provides -100% financial assistance for implementation of NSS Programmes in Jammu & Kashmir and Union Territories without Legislatures

The four faculties and thirty three departments along with special centres of the university produce high quality research publications, books, working papers and D.Phil. theses. The University alumni occupy important positions, in academics, government, private sector, and in fact in all walks of life.

The University through its International Students Advising and Services (ISAS) will continue to play a major role globally in the field of higher education, by seeding new ideas and creating knowledge, and by imparting high level of training with values and social commitment to all its International Students as well. Since its inception on July 14, 2005 as a Central University, the University has reaffirmed to live up to these ideals. We believe that the University is responsible not just for imparting knowledge, but for disseminating knowledge in society; so as to build a better Society at national and international levels in future.

The University has a separate International Students Advisory Board under the International Student Advisor with the Vice Chancellor as the Chairperson to advise and facilitate the International Students.

International Connection

The University stands for humanism and tolerance, for reason, for adventure of ideas and for the search for truth. It stands for the forward march of the human race towards ever higher objectives. The Universities proposes to discharge its duties adequately, and aspires to provide to its International Students the following facilities:

With a view to assist international students, University has established an International Students Office in the University campus. The University of Allahabad model for Internationalization of Higher Education has these unique features:

- 1. In the age of globalization, the University has set out to make its presence felt globally through internationalization of its programmes and opening new avenues of association for global student community.
- 2. With the approval of UGC and the Central Government, the International Student Advisors' Office of the University proposes to have a number of MOUs signed with leading Universities whereby sharing of the facilities in the university and exchange of Faculty and students can be made possible.
- 3. Besides looking after admissions and eligibility, the Office of the International Student Advisor coordinates with ICCR, Ministry of External Affairs, different embassies and consulates for various purposes including grant/award of Scholarships.

Hostel Accommodation Facility:

The University maintains a separate boys' hostel for International Students and female students are accommodated in a separate girls' hostel.

Very soon, the University of Allahabad with the support of the Ministry of Human Resource Development (HRD), Government of India will construct a new hostel for accommodating 158 students with separate state of the art self sustained apartments adjacent to the present International House.

Sponsored Student Programs

The Sponsored Student Program is a part of International Student Advising and Services (ISAS) at the University of Allahabad with the specific goal of assisting sponsors and sponsored students by:

- Supporting the academic goals of sponsored students and their sponsors.
- Providing records of student's academic standing when requested.
- Facilitating communication between students and sponsors to help with financial and administrative questions.
- Working with the Sponsoring Agencies as well as the Foreign Registration Office to answer sponsored students' questions and to help students maintain and understand their immigration status.

Services for Sponsored Students:

- A special orientation session for sponsored students
- Help with providing medical facilities when required. Facilitation is given to Sponsored Students to avail medical insurance, if the student desires.
- Help sponsored students communicate with Academic Departments, and Sponsoring Agencies.
- Reminders for students with expiring financial guarantee/support letters.

Services for the Sponsor:

- A special orientation session for sponsored students.
- Student transcripts to show academic standing upon request.
- Special campus meetings for sponsors to meet with their students.
- Manage Financial Guarantee for Sponsorship

Activities of the International Student Office:

The University of Allahabad attracts a large number of foreign students in comparison to all other Indian Universities. Apart from offering a multi-cultural and inter-disciplinary learning environment, one of the main reasons for studying in Allahabad is the manageable cost of living and a favourable environment for education. Currently, we have around 145 students, from over 15 countries studying at the University and its affiliated colleges.

The International Students Office of the University of Allahabad assisted the International Students' Community, in acquiring information about the various courses, colleges, tuition fee structure, eligibility, accommodation, health insurance and the accommodation offered by the University. It was also operative in arranging for the students' admissions and their overall welfare.

The International Student Office administered the special over and above quota of International Students, created jointly by the Ministry of External Affairs and Ministry of Human Resources and Development (MEA & MHRD) Government of India. The International Student Office acting as the nodal agency that coordinates all the activities related to the admission of International Students, provided facilities through a unique single-window system. Apart from handling the admissions and eligibility procedures, the International Student Office coordinated with the Indian Council for Cultural Research (ICCR), Ministry of External Affairs and Ministry of Human Resources and Development (MEA & MHRD) and with different Embassies and Consulates for various purposes including getting scholarships as well as administering MoU's with International Partners of higher education.

The International Student Office acted as a liaison between the students, the various Departmental Heads, and the Heads of Colleges and Institutions affiliated under the University of Allahabad as well as the Heads of Chancery, Embassies, Consulates, their educational counselors and their educational wings, throughout the world or with any other agencies of the Government of India or the Government of other countries.

- In order to improve the procedures and to be versed with the best practices in other Academic bodies and thus boost the efficiency of the ISA's Office, the Vice Chancellor Prof. Rattan Lal Hangloo and the ISA Prof. Sanjeev Bhadauria are constantly in contact with the Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR), New Delhi and other academic Institutions, Institutes and Organizations.
- The Annual Mock Convocation ceremony was successfully held on April 08, 2018 in which the Dean Students Welfare Prof. RKP Singh, Prof. Meera Dixit, Prof. Mushtaq Ali and Dr. Satya Dev were present.

PROCTOR OFFICE

Discharge of Duty

- In order to create a safe and friendly environment for students, the Proctor of the University has constituted a 24x7 Security Cell. The Cell is dedicated to ensure discipline, dignity and peace in and around the University campus.
- After completion of admissions in the current academic year, around 25000 students (new and old) were provided Identity Cards. Records have been computerised and well documented.
- In the previous academic session 3800 students were provided with character certificates.
- The admission process as well as the admission test conducted for the undergraduate, postgraduate and other courses were carried out successfully with the support of the Proctorial Board.
- The annual examinations and all other main examinations were conducted by the University smoothly with the help of strict security and frisking at all centres.
- During the entrance examination conducted for the current academic session jammers and strict checking were used to ensure fair examinations.
- An Admission Cell was constituted by the Proctor in order to provide assistance to the newly enrolled students at the University campus.
- In compliance to the ruling of the Supreme Court a complete ban was put on ragging. Further:
 - Anti-ragging committees were constituted in every hostel and faculty of the University.
 - The contact details of the members of the Anti-ragging committees were made available to students by displaying on notice boards in each department and hostel of the University.
- The Allahabad University Students' Union election was held successfully with the support of the Proctorial Board. The details of each enrolled student were well documented. There were approximately 19,987 valid voters during the elections held in 2017-18.
- In order to address the problems and complaints of the female students a separate women cell was formed by the Proctor. Female members of the Proctorial Board took active participation in resolving the issues of the students along with fulfilling their responsibilities at their best.
- In order maintain the discipline in the campus the proctor office issued: 46 show-cause notices, 12 restications, 12 suspensions as well as 42 FIRs were lodged at the Colonelganj Police Station.
- To asses the issues of previously suspended/resticated students committees were constituted to take decisions on the removal of suspension/restications. The activities of some students are still being investigated by the Committees.
- An FIR was lodged against identified students of the University in the nearby police station against destruction of infrastructure of the University worth crores.
- In compliance to the ruling of the Hon'ble High Court a historical wash out was conducted at each and every hostel of the University. Anti-social elements living in the hostel for more than 20-25 years were forced to leave the premises.

Requirements

- Proposals have been sent for updation and requirement of modern equipments for the office of the Proctor and to install CCTV cameras at selected points along with their monitoring.
- In order to ensure the safety of the students, construction of a check-post on the round about near the girls' hostel has been submitted.
- Proposal for onstruction of a portico near the main gate, north of the Proctorial Office, has become necessary to ensure the comfort of students and parents during the mansoon and summer.

CENTRAL CULTURAL COMMITTEE

A Cultural Committee, comprising of senior faculties from various departments was formed at the initiative and Patronship of Vice-Chancellor Prof. R. L. Hangloo in the session 2016-17 under Chairmanship of Prof. A. A Fatmi, Head, Department of Urdu.

A brief report of Central Cultural Committee, AU for the session 2017-18:

- On 15th August, 2017 and 26th January, 2018 the Central Cultural Committee organized the functions of Independence Day and Republic Day in the senate hall of the University. Eminent personalities from the city and within the University were felicitated; and selected teachers, employees and students were honoured with the award of excellence by Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor Prof. R.L. Hangloo on both the occasions.

CENTRAL FACILITIES

CENTRAL LIBRARY

Introduction:

The Central Library has started its journey on the path of improvement. It was established to cater the needs of the students, research scholars, and teachers of the University. It not only helps in supporting the class room instructional programmes of the university, but also unfolds the horizon of knowledge with regard to the different research programmes carried out by the university.

The Central Library developed out of the library of the Muir Central College, Allahabad (established in 1872, and affiliated with the university from 1872 to 1922, when it was subsumed in the university upon beginning it career as a teaching university). Foundation stone of the university library building was laid by Sir John Hewett on 17th Jan.1910. The University Library was started in 1916. In 1946-47, Dr.S.R. Ranganathan, Father of Library Science in India, was invited to suggest ways and means of improving the library. He submitted the development plan in March 1947, which was published by the university in the same year. Its contents covered wide range of areas: such as new library building, manpower, finance and other relevant items. A special committee was constituted to review the library development plan submitted by Dr. Ranganathan. The committee pointed out that the central library building constructed in 1913-16 was inadequate. The most satisfactory thing would be to erect a new building designed in accordance with the modern library practice. It recommended the conversion of the Darbangha Hall into a reading room for 500 under-graduates (250 on the ground floor and 250 on the first floor. A portion of the graduates reading room was to be divided into private cubicles for the use by serious students or research scholars. After some times it was felt that space in Darbhanga hall is inadequate to store the reading materials and provide library services.. The present library building was constructed in 1973. The present library building is more spacious and has potential for further expansion. The old library building is now occupied by the office of the Registrar, as well as Accounts and General section of the University.

Dewey Decimal Classification Scheme (DDC) and Anglo American Cataloguing Rules-2nd edition (AACR-2) are followed for the purpose of classifying and cataloguing the documents. LIBSYS-4, Library Management Software is being used for creation of database.

Classification: Total 18288 vols of books were classified according to Dewey Decimal Classification Scheme. Processed books were added to stack area, reading hall, reference section etc. of the Central Library and various departmental libraries of Faculty of Science, Commerce and Law.

Data Entry/ Computerization: During this period total 18288 volumes of books were entered into the LIBSYS Software Database. This database can be accessed through OPAC by Author, Title, Subject, Publisher, Keyword etc. and one can make Boolean searches also.

User Services:

Working Hours: Library is kept open from 8:00AM to 9:00 PM from Monday to Saturday and from 10:00 AM to 6:00 PM on Sundays and holidays except on Republic Day, Holi, Eid-ul-Fitr, Independence Day, Mahatma Gandhi's Birthday, Vijaya Dashami, Diwali and Christmas.

Photocopy Service: Central Library is providing photocopying service to its users with digital photocopy machine. During this period students/research scholars/teachers were provided approx. **3**, **57**,**400** photocopies for their study and research.

Newspapers & Magazines: Newspapers, Newsletters and Magazines subscribed /received from various sources are displayed separately in the Newspapers Section. During this period 17 National /State/Local newspapers in Hindi and English, and 34 current popular magazines in English and Hindi were subscribed. Users make extensive use of them for their information requirements.

Textbook Consultation: Students of different courses are provided textbooks for consultation from textbook section. During this period about 2200-2500 books were consulted daily by the students.

Use of the Library: During the year under report total approx. 1, 35,500 users consulted the library. It had been observed that February to June are the lean months when comparatively less students come to library but from July to January the library is heavily used by the students.

Outside Research Scholars/Teachers: During this period 310 research scholars and teachers from various universities/instituted of the country such as : Shakuntala Mishra University, Lucknow, Nehru Gram Bharti University, Allahabad, Bihar Central University, Patna, Rajasthan Central University, Aligarh Muslim University, Aligarh, Banaras Hindu University, Varanasi, Lucknow University, Lucknow, Jammu University, Jammu, U.P.R.T.Open University, Allahabad, D.D. University, Gorakhpur, C.C.S. University Meerut, University of Delhi, Delhi, Jawahar Lal Nehru University, Delhi,V.B.S.Purvanchal University Jaunpur, RML Avadh University Faizabad, Mahatma Gandhi Kashi Vidyapeeth, Varanasi, B.R.A. University Agra, Rani Durgawati University, Jabalpur, A.P.S. University Rewa, CSJM University Kanpur, PG College Mirzapur, PG College Handia, Govt. ENGINEERING AND WORKS DEPARTMENT

Introduction

After regaining the Central Status, University has added more than 65000 Sq. mtr. of plinth area during last 10 years and several projects are under pipe line for execution which will add additional plinth area to the University.

The varied nature of buildings, its architecture, age of infrastructures, satellite nature of campuses, etc. poses great challenge to cope-up with the pressure for its proper maintenance and prompt disposal of problems of the users.

The University Engineer supported by various categories of technical staff is heading the Engineering Section of the University. The available staffs with the University Engineer are as per the need of the University when it was State University with limited resources and infrastructure. However as the University started expanding its infrastructure tuning to the changed need of the University, the need of expanding the technical work force is also being felt. The Executive Council has approved the structure of the office of the University Engineer which is as follow:

Establishment of North Hall as Meeting Cum Seminar Hall

Constructed in 1912 Senate Hall Building was designed by the renowned Architect Sir Swinton Jacob. The building has three major components viz North Hall, Senate Hall & South Hall. The Building has been built in the Indo-Saracenic style having European layout and well planed interior. North Hall of the Senate Building was used for holding meetings of various natures. As a part of augmenting the existing infrastructure preserving the heritage the North Hall was upgraded converting it into modern meeting cum seminar hall having facility of air conditioning, public address system, power point presentation, etc. The facility is under regular use and caters the need of University to hold meetings/seminar.



Establishment of Finance Officer and Registrar Office

In continuation of establishment of a centralized administrative setup in phase by manner the work for the office of the Finance Officer and Registrar was completed and made functional.



Internal Repair and painting of Entire University Hostel

In view of the order of Hon'ble High Court the entire hostel of the University was evicted after a period of more than 30 years and as per the order the hostels were internaly repaired and painted within record time of one month.

UNIVERSITY INDUSTRY INTERFACE CELL

- To identify opportunities for extending relations with industry through various activities, including commissioned research projects and topic-oriented technical seminars.

Activities during 2017-18

Innovation Club of University of Allahabad selected in Top Ten Innovators of the country

A team of three scientists comprises Prof. M.P. Singh (Biotechnologist), Dr. Lokendra Kumar (Physicist) and Dr. Awadh B Yadav (Biotechnologist) of Innovation Club, University of Allahabad participated in the Festival of Innovation and Entrepreneurship (FINE) during March 20-21, 2018 at Rashtrapati Bhavan and selected in Top Ten Innovators of the country out of 70 proposal received from India's premier Institutions. The Festival of Innovation & Entrepreneurship

(FINE) is a unique initiative of the office of the President of India to recognise, Celebrate, respect and reward grassroots innovations and foster a supportive ecosystem. FINE also provides the platform to the innovators for building the linkages with potential stakeholders whose support can improve their prospects in coming years for the larger social good.





Prof. M. P. Singh innovated low cost mushroom cultivation technology on locally available agrowastes to sort out both the problems of agro-wastes accumulation and malnutrition by producing cheaper protein on valueless agro-wastes. This low cost technology can motivate farmers and underprivileged people to go for startup industry. This will mitigate unemployment and improve socio-economic condition of uneducated, unskilled landless poor farmers. This technology can also be used for remediation of heavy metals and toxins from coal washery effluents as well as dye industries

Dr. Lokendra Kumar presented some design and operation of emerging next generation solar cells which are different from conventional Inorganic-Silicon Solar cells and a topic of great interest for potentially low cost solar energy conversion into electrical energy and possibility of many novel applications e.g. portable solar cells, and building integrated solar cells etc. Here, the key message is the importance of understanding of basic materials properties of organic and hybrid materials and new designs to get very low cost and efficient devices.

Dr. Awadh developed cheap biodegradable Sanitary napkins which can easily fabricated using cheaply available materials locally i.e. banana fibres, pineapple fibres etc. This will prevent 23% of girls drop out from School due to menstruation cycle and 14% girls reported to have menstrual infection.

UGC HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT CENTRE

Introduction:

Higher Education in the 21st century is confronted with an ever changing world and India too is experiencing a paradigm shift in the role of Higher Education in national development. For this the HE system requires quality teachers who are knowledgeable, creative, inspiring, good researchers, IT savvy, effective managers and role models, The UGC-Human Resource Development Centre (formerly Academic Staff College), University of Allahabad has envisaging its new multidimensional and integrative role in HE, become an active hub of academic activity for improving the quality of teachers which is the single most crucial and critical success factor for sustenance of HE in the present era of globalization, Realizing the different paradigms for quality management in HE, which include the paradigm of process control (accreditation), paradigm of integral quality management (TQM and EFQM) and paradigm of breakthrough and innovations, the HRDC has based its activities primarily on three components- quality of design, quality of conformance and quality of performance in order to control its quality and meet the standards required for assuring quality in teachers of HE and to train and develop human resource fit to face the challenges of HE in the Indian as well as the global context

The main aim .of the Human Resource Development Centre (HRDC) has been to facilitate quality education by upgrading the knowledge and performance of teachers serving in Universities and their affiliated Colleges. By organizing the abovementioned programmes, the Staff College has given the teachers, the opportunity to come to a platform where interactions with eminent resource persons and with other teacher participants were possible. The programmes covering a wide spectrum of subjects have provided the crucial link between motivation of teachers for creative and innovative teaching and research, commitment towards their profession, academic leadership and quality education. Some of the approaches undertaken by this HRDC to fulfill its aims to enhance the personality, performance, awareness and knowledge of the teacher participants include-

- Invocation of basic thoughts on being a good teacher Values, Character, Commitment, Team Building, Work Culture, Human Resource Development and Academic Leadership qualities required in teachers for Societal Transformation,
- Creating Computer Awareness and in this way developing IT trained human Capital for quality education of the future generation, Power point Presentation, LCD and OHP usage
- Revitalizing inputs for Higher education through Teacher empowerment, Inter-disciplinary dialogues, open and flexible Trans-disciplinary subjects, Innovative teaching Methodologies, Collaboration with Academic, Research and Specialized Institutes
- Creating awareness about the higher education System, Rules ,Regulations, Statutes and Policies, Motivation for Research, Project Writing, Funding Agencies and Avenues
- Weaving Gender Justice and Gender Equality in the system through lectures/ workshops/seminars on Capacity Building, Gender Sensitization and Gender awareness
- Stressing the importance of mental and physical health by lectures and demonstrations by Yoga Experts and practice sessions by the teacher participants. This has become an integral part of all Orientation Programmes
- Organizing programmes and activities related to Social and Communal Harmony, Secularism and National Integrity such as lectures and Literary programmes, Essay Writing Competitions, Cultural Evenings, Group Discussions and Seminars
- Inviting eminent Resource Persons and Subject Experts for both OPs and RCs and giving teachers the opportunity to interact with them.

"NAAC" review of Human Resource Development Centre took place from February27 -29, 2012 under the chairmanship of Prof. Sunil Gupta, the former Vice Chancellor of H P University, Shimla. Human Resource Development Centre is determined to work in accordance to recommendations given by the NAAC Peer Team and Academic Advisory Committee under the chairmanship of Hon'ble Vice Chancellor Prof. A K Singh.

During the session 2017-2018, for which the report is being submitted, the UGC-HRDC has successfully completed most of the programmes allocated by the UGC for the session. It has organized 3 out of 4 Orientation Programmes with 167 participants and 03 out of 06 Refresher Courses with 133 participants. Besides the subject Refresher Courses conducted by the concerned department, 3 Interdisciplinary Refresher Courses were organized successfully by the HRDC .This included 1 ID in Environment Studies, 1 ID in Computer Application and 1 ID in Social Sciences. The HRDC has

organized a Special Summer School with 39 participants and one Winter School has organized a Winter School with 26 participants in session 2017-2018. It is my pleasure to report here that this HRDC has been ranked amongst the first ten HRDCs of the country based on the OPs and the RCs conducted by the HRDCs. (Detail attached Session 2017-2018)

Keeping the momentum gained in the preceding years going, the office lent support in speedy disposal of academic and other related matters through the committees constituted by the order of the Vice Chancellor. The major tasks entrusted were handled successfully and capped effectively are as follows:

REPORT OF THE CONSTITUENT COLLEGES / INSTITUTES OF UNIVERSITY OF ALLAHABAD

ALLAHABAD DEGREE COLLEGE

Allahabad Degree College, a Constituent College of University of Allahabad, established in 1956, aims to fulfill the needs of the society in terms of quest for knowledge. It provides equal opportunity to all students, including those belonging to socially and economically weaker sections of the society to study multiple disciplines, including social sciences, humanities, commerce, law, basic and applied sciences, with the aid of best practices, qualified teachers, teaching aids and infrastructure, under the academic leadership of the University of Allahabad. Admission in the College is made on the basis of Combined Under Graduate Admission Tests (UGAT- B.A., B.Sc., and B.Com.) and also for Admission test in LL.B., organized by the University of Allahabad.
