Things are, in fact, taking colossal shapes of growth and impetus in the fourth oldest Institution of India, famously called the University of Allahabad. The University not only cherishes the legacy of proper mentorship among its pupils but also retains a wide range of distinguished names it has produced, and these names are of great writers, researchers, teachers, poets, jurists, political leaders, Vice presidents, Chief Justices, judges and so on, who have substantially contributed to the nation building. One of the dignitaries who has further expanded the glorious horizon of the University is Prof. Sangita Srivastava, the present Vice Chancellor of the University. Beyond doubt, she has billowed a new breath of life into the soul of the university, which was in a stupor for a long period. The lush green campus and heritage value of the land stands for its unique glory. Prof. Srivastava is entirely committed to making the university technology-driven, and thus, online admission/examination/feedback/verification forms are made available for students. We have reached the halfway mark in our VC's tenure, but the measures undertaken so far have brought a fillip to our varsity's upward climb, from which there is no looking back. There is yet a lot for us to learn from her. TWO SPLENDID YEARS, AND THE JOURNEY CONTINUES

How a woman Vice Chancellor provided oxygen to a gasping institution

It was two years back that Prof Sangita Srivastava joined as the Vice Chancellor of University of Allahabad. Those were very testing times. The whole world was in the grip of a pandemic which had no cure. It was in those testing times that we witnessed the humane face of the first woman Vice Chancellor. Going beyond the protocol the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor helped many with timely medical intervention saving several lives. Her foresight to close the University was lauded far and wide. We have seen what happened to those institutions which continued to remain open.

It was in her first year that she paid special attention to those problems of the University which no one else had cared to solve. The facade of the University changed dramatically. The Senate hall, the Vizianagaram Hall and the gardens all testify to her initiatives.

I am witness to her efforts when she would come and sit almost alone in her office for long hours when the University was officially closed due to pandemic. The list is long and may need a full page to enumerate the initiatives the Vice Chancellor took in her first year. Seeing her perform in the first year, I stumbled upon an interesting analogy. I got reminded of the great Sunil Gavaskar. The Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, just like Gavaskar, played all the correct strokes which had the hallmark of a genius at work.

Many of her well-wishers, including myself, thought that during her first year as VC she had done exceedingly well. We were in for a surprise and she proved us all wrong when she took guard in her second year. Voila, her second year of VC was far more eventful and fulfilling than her first year. And then all of us realised that she played her second year like Sachin Tendulkar. She played all strokes with finesse making every day a special one. We realized it was very difficult to match her energy and commitment. At 6.30 am she was at the Vizianagaram hall doing yoga, at 9 am she supervised gardeners at the cricket ground, by 10 am she was sitting in a selection committee, at 6 pm she was disposing files. My God, we all are amazed by her commitment. Her score of >250 appointments in a yearis faster than a Sachin Tendulkar century!!

On behalf of the teaching fraternity, I pray to God that the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor is blessed with good health for many many years to come.

Happy hearts and happy spaces are the secret to creating a happy place to work in. As the first woman to the university Prof Sangita Srivastava knows that the university needs to be given Academic, Administrative, Aesthetic, cultural but most of all the human touch. The task before her requires the commitment of a team not of just a handful but the entire fraternity. And like a true leader she has reached out to one and all. A lot of work in the university was pending, on the back burners or simply shelved forgotten and stuck for decades. Dust has been cleaned from many such shelves and cobwebs of crippling red tape pruned away. Most of the time things get stuck when there is a failure to realize that files are not just papers but lives of people being treated with dishonesty and apathy. Unhappy people cannot create happy spaces or hope in the future. Such hope is now ignited with new appointments, new infrastructure largely regulated promotions and a recognition being given among peers for work done, leading to a desire to excel. There have been challenges but she has led her team with grit. Her complete commitment, absolute integrity and unending hard work inspire the teachers and students to strive explore their potential. The lines below capture all that she has achieved so far with her grit and determination.

प्रोफेसर संगीता श्रीवास्तव कुलपित इलाहाबाद विश्वविद्यालय जिस तरह से विश्वविद्यालय के शिक्षकों कर्मचारियों एवं छात्र छात्राओं के लिए प्रेरणा स्रोत है, वह शब्दों में व्यक्त करना एक अत्यंत दुरूह कार्य है। प्रो. श्रीवास्तव ने अपने सकारात्मक दृष्टिकोण और कड़ी मेहनत से पिछले 2 वर्षों में विश्वविद्यालय के स्वरूप में वह बदलाव ला दिया जिसकी उम्मीद मैंने अपने पिछले 2 दशक के कार्यकाल में भी नहीं की थी। इतना ही नहीं वह अपने स्वयं के उदाहरण द्वारा विश्वविद्यालय के समस्त शिक्षकों एवं कर्मचारियों को विश्वविद्यालय के लिए कुछ अच्छा और अलग करने के लिए लगातार प्रेरित करती रहती हैं।

वैसे प्रो. श्रीवास्तव के लिए यह नया नहीं है। हम लोग उन भाग्यशाली शिक्षकों में से हैं जिन्होंने उनकी कार्यशैली को उस दौर में करीब से देखा है जब उन्होंने अपनी नेतृत्व क्षमता को दर्शाते हुए अकेले एक विभाग को ना सिर्फ खड़ा किया बल्कि पटल पर ख्याति भी दिलाई। यह घटना साल 2007-2008 की है, जब उन्होंने गृह विज्ञान में परास्नातक पाठ्यक्रम शुरू करने के लिए सभी उचित व्यक्तियों से पाठ्यक्रम संबंधित सुझाव लिए थे। और मैं उन भाग्यशाली व्यक्तियों में से था और मेरा भी प्रथम परिचय उसी दौरान हुआ। उस समय उनकी कर्तव्यनिष्ठा, परिश्रम, लगन और ललक देखकर मेरे जैसा किनिष्ठ शिक्षक भी प्रभावित हुए बिना नहीं रह पाया। वह समय भी नहीं भूला जा सकता जब उन्होंने एक राज्य विश्वविद्यालय, जिसकी अपनी इमारत भी नहीं थी, को ना सिर्फ खड़ा किया बल्कि पूरे भारत एक उदाहरण भी प्रस्तृत किया।

वह अपने सहयोगियों का भी बहुत ध्यान रखती हैं । मुझे 2021 के वह भयावह पल भूले भी नहीं भूलते जब कोरोना की दूसरी लहर ने संपूर्ण भारत को अपनी गिरफ्त में ले लिया था। मैं भी कोरोनाग्रस्त होने के कारण एवं बुखार ना उतरने के कारण मन से टूट चुका था, लेकिन प्रो. श्रीवास्तव प्रतिदिन फोन पर एक सकारात्मक बातचीत के द्वारा उस अवसाद की मानसिकता से लगातार मुझे बाहर निकाल रही थी। उस गंभीर दौर में मेरे घर में सिर्फ मेरी पत्नी ही स्वस्थ थी और उनका मेरी पत्नी से कोई परिचय भी नहीं था. लेकिन वह मेरी पत्नी से भी बात करती थी और साथ में निर्देश देती थी कि क्या खाने पीने को देना है और कई तरीके के व्यंजन और सूप बनाने की विधि भी बताती थी। साथ ही बाद में मुझसे अलग से पूछती थी कि वह व्यंजन और सूप मिले या नहीं और उनका स्वाद कैसा लगा । कभी-कभी हम लोग यह छोटी-छोटी घटनाएं सोचने बैठते है तो मेरी पत्नी सिर्फ यही कहती है कि इतनी देखभाल तो सिर्फ माँ या बड़ी बहन ही कर सकती हैं। मुझे बाद में पता चला कि उन्होंने जिस किसी के बारे में भी कोरोना की सूचना मिली उसको प्रत्यक्ष या अप्रत्यक्ष रूप से उस भयानक दौर में सहायता की और सकारात्मक ऊर्जा दी। ऐसा कार्य तो सिर्फ एक ममतामयी माँ ही कर सकती है।

यह सब तो एक उदाहरण है लेकिन और भी बहुत सारे ऐसे कारण हैं; जिसके कारण मुझे लगता है इलाहाबाद विश्वविद्यालय भाग्यशाली हैं जिसने अपनी स्थापना की दूसरी शताब्दी में ऐसी ममतामई कुलपित पायी है जो उचित समय पर निडरता पूर्वक निर्णय लेती है तथा लगातार यह सोचती है कि उनके हर एक पल का विश्वविद्यालय की बेहतरी के लिए कैसे इस्तेमाल हो।

यह और भी कई बातों से स्पष्ट है जैसे 2 वर्षों में लगभग 250 नयी नियुक्तियां, विज्ञान संकाय का कायाकल्प, नए छात्रावास और ढेर सारे ऐसे विकास कार्य जिनकी कल्पना कम से कम हम शिक्षक पिछले दो दशकों में नहीं कर सकते थे।




Patent Cell

A patent is a legal document giving the holder exclusive intellectual property right over a specific invention to make, use or sell the invention for a limited period of 20 years. Since Patents encourage innovations, they help Universities to improve their ranking, establish an innovation ecosystem, incubate knowledge-based startups, earn additional revenue, and measure research activity, along with the recognition of the inventors at the global level.

To streamline the patent filing process in the University of Allahabad and to encourage faculty / researchers, the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor focused on the need for an informative, encouraging, and smooth setup, so a new cell i.e. Patent Cell dedicated only for this purpose was constituted by the University as per notification no. 05-R-3209, dated August 31, 2022. The aim of the cell is to help faculties/researchers of the University for filing patents. The patent cell has drafted the Guidelines and Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) of patent filing and submitted it to the University for Approval from the competent authority. The Guidelines and SOP contain the Clause of Responsibility of Patent Cell, Clause of Financial support, Who can apply, Benefit-sharing, Conflict of interest & Settlement, How to submit a proposal for a patent, Fact sheet to be filled by inventor, General information about patent rules, Application to VC for patent permission, Important links, etc. Under the 'Clause of Financial support,' a corpus fund is proposed, and the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor has assured of the maximum support, even the financial burden of filing a patent would be upon the University. For due recognition and protection of intellectual property, the patent cell invites the inventors to apply for a patent. The contact details, salient points of patent rule and patent information-related links will be displayed on the website of the University soon.

Parenting Styles: Characteristics and Consequences

The self-esteem of a child is by and large affected by the parenting style that is adopted for them. Parent's mode of interaction with their children and the disciplining techniques followed by them cater to their healthy growth and development. When the self-esteem of a child is lowered as a result of inappropriate parenting styles it can have long term future consequences as well. Generally the four types of styles followed Authoritarian, Authoritative, Permissive and Uninvolved. Children are raised in different ways by each of these styles and each one of them has their own pros and cons and different characteristics. A parenting style that promotes healthy growth and development is the key to child's happiness and positive modes of interaction.

Parenting Styles

Authoritarian parents want everything to be done their way. They are very rigid about rules and expect their children to follow them without any questioning. The child's opinion does not matter to them and they are known for their strict compliance to rules and focus on obedience. Physical punishment is a common way for such parents to handle their children and disciplining them. "Because I said so" is the phrase most commonly used by authoritarian parents. Kids brought up in such homes have no room for negotiation, problem solving or dialogue. Kids are made to feel sorry for their mistakes rather than learning from their mistakes.

The long term consequences of authoritarian style of parenting may be grave. Children brought up in such homes may have low self- confidence, low self-

esteem and inability to make decisions. They may be strict follower of rules or may break rules often due to aggression and frustration. Children may show aggressive signs, be frustrated or irritable and may also resort to telling lies in order to avoid punishment.





Researches done in the past have found the authoritative style of parenting to be the most appropriate, effective and developmentally healthy for children. Parents who adopt this parenting style develop a close positive nurturing relationship with their children.

Such parents enforce rules on their children but only after explaining them to their children and taking into consideration their viewpoints. Children are not expected to follow the rules blindly but positive disciplining strategies like motivation, praise and rewards are used by parents to reinforce positive behaviour in children. Children are truly aware of their goals and expectations and frequent dialogues between the two sides are an effective way of problem resolving.

Children brought up by this disciplining technique are more likely to have high self-esteem, become responsible confidant adults, have good decision making capacities and also feel less stressed in adverse situations. They have more emotional control over them and manifest good social behaviour. They also show high levels of academic achievement and school performance.





If you set rules for your children but barely enforce them, if you do not interfere in your children's activities, if you are not concerned about the consequences of your child's actions then you are following the permissive style or "jellyfish" parenting. The basic characteristic of permissive parents is that they are quite lenient with their children and only provide their inputs when there is some serious matter. They are of the opinion that "kids will be kids" and set them free to do whatever they want without any intrusion. They are not rigid in their actions and do not put much effort to discourage bad behaviour or poor choices of their children.

Since permissive parents follow a free approach in raising their children they may be susceptible to a wide range of problems like low academic achievement, low self-esteem, melancholies, and health issues like obesity, insomnia, dental issues in little children, improper food habits, socially disapproved behaviour and lack of self-control. Permissive parents act more like friends for their children and encourage open communication with their children but rarely use any disciplining techniques. The repercussion may be that many times their children take their parents for granted and lose respect for them. Permissive parents have little or no control on their children's screen time as well. Freedom given to the children to such an extent may develop negative habits in

them like being impulsive, demanding, and selfish and they may also lack self- regulation.



Sometimes you may have come across parents who are rarely concerned about their child's school work, are least interested about their whereabouts or do not like to spend time with them. These are the characteristics of an uninvolved parent. Such parents possess little or no knowledge about what their children are doing and expect children to raise themselves. Children of uninvolved parents are like free birds and do not receive much guidance, nurturing or attention from their parents. These parents are also of the belief that children will develop better if left on their own rather than constant attention and guidance. They may be so busy at times with their own problems like any health issue, substance abuse or simply managing the household that they may show their inability to care properly for their child's physical and emotional needs. Though they fulfil most of their children's needs but there are no signs of attachment and affection with the child. They also do not follow a particular disciplining style, converse very less with their children and have little or no expectations with them.

A major problem encountered by children of uninvolved parents is their inability to control their emotions. They possess less effective coping strategies, face academic challenges and have difficulty in maintaining or nurturing social relationships. These children may also have selfesteem lower than children brought up by other parenting styles and exhibit behavioural issues as well.



Conclusion

Parenting styles play an important role in shaping children's behaviour and in developing their attitude, values and principles. Each parent has a different approach to rearing children and interacting with them. Hurlock has stated clearly in the principles of child development that each child is unique and there are individual differences in development. Parents as the first mentors of children need to understand these differences and use disciplining techniques that do not hamper the growth and development of children. We need to raise children, who are brimming with confidence, have high self-esteem with adequate life skills as opposed to children who are meek, submissive, arrogant and aggressive. Perfect parenting does not exist and parents need not be despaired if their parenting technique fails. It's not always necessary to follow a single parenting style but can be situation dependent too. The only thing that needs to be remembered as quoted by Dr. Dan Siegel is that "there is always a room to reconnect after a rupture".


