


your money going in the right hands. A committee has been put in place to monitor and regulate your money.

Award for excellence

Award for excellence goes to Prof J.K. Pati



Prof Jayanta Kumar Pati was born on 4th June, 1961 in Rourkela, Odisha. He has done BSc (Hons) from Sambalpur University, Odisha and later he pursued M.Tech (App Geology) from IIT Roorkee (Earlier Univ of Roorkee) in 1985. He completed his PhD from Univ of Allahabad in Experimental mineralogy and petrology in 1993.

He has Served the Geological Survey of India, Govt. of India from 1992-2000 as a Geologist (Gazetted Class-1 Officer) and served one Term as a Core Faculty Member of the Training Institute, Geological Survey of India.

He joined UoA as Reader in 2000. In 2008 he was promoted to Professor.

Presently he is Director of National centre of experimental mineralogy & petrology and Professor of Geology.

The Ministry of Earth Sciences, Government of India has awarded a project worth Rs.70.73 lakhs to Prof. J.K. Pati, Department of Earth and Planetary Sciences, Nehru Science Centre, University of Allahabad to undertake the following study and complete in next three years.


The TTG (tonalite–trondhjemite–granodiorite) is a rock, predominantly older than 2500 million years and can be as old as 4000 million years or more. Since the formation of the Earth (~4500 million years), the earliest dated rocks are largely believed to be devoid of life and comprising TTG gneiss (a layered/banded rock). The TTG is considered as the oldest typical juvenile portion of the continents and marks the transition from a dominantly mafic (magnesium-iron- rich) to a more felsic crust in the Earth's early history.

These are relatively rare rocks as the as early Earth underwent several recycling processes. In India, other than Singhbhum craton, these rocks are found only in Bundelkhand and Dharwar (Karnataka State) cratons. Prof Pati and his group have already reported rocks as old as 3560 million years from the Bundelkhand craton and the present project is to look for a Hadean (age ≥ 4000 million years) crust. Since gold, molybdenum, iron, uranium and platinum mineralization are dominantly associated with the rocks of Early Earth.

Research Pursuits

Prof Pati is a hard-core researcher. Presently his area of interests revolves around petrological study of mafic-ultramafic rocks of Madaura area, Lalitpur district, U.P. and their PGE potential; mineralogy and petrology of high-grade BIF and some restites occurring within Bundelkhand Granitoid Complex; He has edited Ms. for the Meteoritics and Planetary Sciences, USA, the Bull. Geol. Soc. America, USA, the Geological Magazine, Cambridge University Press, Journal of Geology, Journal Asian Earth Sciences. He is Editor, Society for Earth Scientists, India. Editor, Malaysian Journal of Geosciences, and many others.

- Proud moment for UoA, Prof Pati with his dedication and hard work has put Dhala structure in the World Map of the Terrestrial Impact Craters!
- Govt. of India published Dhala Field Guide Book (2020) authored by Prof Pati, which is a deferred publication in 2022 due to COVID-19.



Prof Pati has been an invited speaker in International conferences like Yokohama National University, Yokohama, Japan, University of Witwatersrand, Johannesburg, South Africa, Nancy, France, Leibniz Institute, Humboldt University, Berlin, Germany, Department of National Heritage, Govt. of Malaysia, Kuala Lumpur, Casablanca, Morocco, Denver, USA, Vredefort Dome, South Africa; Meteoritical Society Meeting, Greenwich, London, U.K., etc.

Hobbies

Prof Pati is a hard-core researcher, and is also a nature lover. His hobbies include : Watercolor Painting, Collage Making, Carving, Gardening Mostly Exotic plants - (Adeniums, Sansevierias, Cacti and Bonsai plants etc.), Showing Dogs (mostly imported breeds), photography and writing poems etc. He has a huge collection of plants!

He grows fruits in his garden and birds get the first priority to enjoy the fruits of labour! He has some rain lilies, Sansevierias Snake Plants; and exotic hybrids. Some Cacti, Adenium Arabicum and many exotic hybrids. He is a dog lover.


KARGIL VIJAY DIWAS
